Prayers of the People

In our bulletin they are called the "Prayers of Intercession", but growing up, I knew them as the "Prayers of the People". In the old red hymnal, (The Service Book and Hymnal "SBH" which was published in

1958), they are called the Prayer of the Church. I'm talking about the prayer that the Assisting Minister prays during our worship services, ending each petition with something like "Lord, in your mercy" or "Hear us, O God" to which we respond with something like "Hear our prayer" or "Your mercy is great." Those prayers which are lifted up for the church, the world, those in need, and all of God's creation are intended to be an expression of our communal desire, for peace, for healing, for justice, for faith, for vital ministry, and for the well-being of all people and for the well-being of the creation itself.

We pray these prayers, that are intended to express our deep needs for God's intercession in our lives and in the world, but the words that we use, though often beautiful and always faithful, are not our words. They are my words, or the words of our larger church. There is nothing wrong with using the words of others to express our own desires in prayer. After all, the Psalms are the hymns and prayers of other people. Many of our hymns that we sing in times of joy and sorrow are the prayers of other people. Many of the saints who have gone before us, have left us a legacy of their prayers that can give shape to our needs at times when our own words fail us. The words of others to express our prayers can at times be sufficient and at other times soaring expressions of our own faith.

But this year, during the season of Lent, at our 11:15 a.m. service, we are going to try using our own words to express our prayer for the church, the world, those in need, and the creation. We are going to experience praying the "prayers of the people" using the words of the people.

Here's how this will work: There will be slips of paper in the pews for the 11:15 service. Either before the service begins or at any time before the Hymn of the Day you can write what you would like to pray for on those slips of paper. You don't have to write a fully formed "prayer" or petition, just a concern that you have for or about the world, the church, or someone you know who is struggling. You can also lift up those things for which you are thankful, ways that you have seen God at work in the world or in your life, or ways that you have been blessed. The prayer slips will be collected during the hymn of the day, and when it comes time for the "Prayers of the People" the Assisting Minister and Pastor will lift up your words, as an expression of all of our prayers.

At the 8:45 service, we will continue to intercede for the church, the world, those in need, and God's creation using my words and the words of others. Between the two worship services, our prayers, prayed in different ways and with different words, will ascend before God and we will be strengthened by our worship and by the meal that we receive to go in peace, and be an answer to other people's prayers in our daily lives.

I look forward to praying with you this Lenten season.
