


Whole-ly Holy

Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought with a price..." 1 Corinthians 6:19-20a

I floss my teeth every day. I'm sure that you're all delighted to know that

I have good dental hygiene. I'm telling you that because of the reason that I floss my teeth every morning. I floss my teeth because of Jesus. I told my dental hygienist that once. She was confused, but happy that my teeth were in such great condition. Whatever works!

This is what I mean when I say that I floss my teeth because of Jesus. About 12 years ago, my church did an activity like the one that we have coming up here at Emmanuel, the **Whole and Holy Life Challenge**. The Whole and Holy Life Challenge is an opportunity offered by the Stewardship Team, a way for us to recognize that we are called to be good stewards of our money, but also of so much more than our money. We are called to be good stewards of our minds, our relationships, our bodies, our spiritual lives, and of the earth itself.

The Whole and Holy Life Challenge is a fun way for people of all ages to practice that good stewardship and to build healthy habits, that might, in fact, last a lifetime! The Challenge will begin on September 29th, 12:30-1:30 p.m. with a pot-luck salad luncheon (You know, healthy.). Participants will be given a packet of information about the challenge and will be put on a team. The packet of information will have a description of how to earn points in 6 categories, Physical Activity, Nutrition, Mind/Relationships, Spirituality, General Health, and Stewardship. It will also have point charts for every week of the five-week challenge. Participants will keep track of how many points they earn in each category and then report their weekly totals to their team captain at the end of every week. Part of what makes the challenge challenging is that you have to get at least one point in every category every day in order for any of your points for that day to count. So, you can't just focus on one aspect of life in order to succeed at the challenge. We are called to be whole; to lead balanced lives and this challenge helps us do that. For some people it will be easy to get points in the Physical Activity category, but getting a daily spirituality point might be more challenging. For other people, the opposite might be true. But the challenge is part of what makes it fun! It helps us to learn about ourselves and to grow as people.

There is friendly competition aspect of this challenge, which is why there are teams and points. At the end of the challenge, we will come together as a congregation, to celebrate the winning team, but mostly to celebrate, the way that God has called us together as a community, to work for God's purposes in the world together, to support each other and to live out our calling as stewards together. Because at the core of everything, we remember that we live by grace, the final celebration at the end of the challenge will be an ice cream social at the end of the challenge, on November 3^{rd} , between the services. And of course, everyone is welcome!

So, back to my flossed teeth. One of the ways that you can get a point in the general health category is by flossing your teeth. So, 12 years ago, I started flossing my teeth every day. It was an easy way to get the general health point. But when the challenge ended, I kept flossing my teeth. I had discovered that it didn't take that long and for my whole life my dentists had been telling me to floss my teeth. It couldn't hurt and it *has* helped. But the crazy thing is that in addition to helping me have healthy teach and gums, every time I floss my teeth, I remember that I am a child of God, that I am steward of my whole life, my teeth, my body, my mind and relationships, by spiritual life, my money, and the earth. Because of the challenge, flossing my teeth has become spiritual discipline! I must admit, when I was going for the easy point, I didn't see that coming!

A couple of logistics:

If you want to participate in the challenge, but you can't come to the luncheon on **September 29th**, you can sign up through the church website at <u>http://wip.emmanuelnorwood.org/whole-and-holy-challenge/</u> or by emailing me at <u>pastor@emmanuelnorwood.org</u>. You will be placed on a team and we will get you materials so that you can participate.

There is a step counting activity that can be a way to get points in the Physical Activity category. You do need a step counting device if you want to participate in this part of the challenge. There will be pedometers available for \$11.00 each at the Whole and Holy Life Challenge Kick-Off Luncheon on September 29th. You can also use your own step counting device if you already have one. There are also other ways to get points in the physical health category. A step counter is not required for participation.

There are ways for people of most ages to participate in the challenge, from kids in elementary school through seniors. It can be a fun thing for families to do together, either on a team together or competing with each other!

I hope that you will give the Whole and Holy Life Challenge a try. It's fun, it's a good way to learn about yourself, it's community building, it might help you develop a life-long healthy habit, it can even be identity forming. It can help us remember that God cares about every aspect of our lives!

This is a big month at Emmanuel, with lots going on. Because of that, you get two Envoy articles!

Hopefully by now, you've heard about the **Ezekiel 37** meeting that is coming up on **October 6**th, but in case you haven't, the Ezekiel 37 meeting is an opportunity for us to get together as a community and learn about our ministry teams, the things that they do, the challenges that they face, and the way that those challenges make it hard for us to be as effective as we want to be at caring for each other, caring for our community, and being good stewards of the resources that God has blessed us with as a congregation. At the Ezekiel 37 meeting, in addition to learning about our current structure and challenges that we face, you'll also learn about plans to try

something new for our ministry teams, that will hopefully make it easier for them to welcome new people, do their work, and live out their purpose and calling.

We're calling this effort the Ezekiel 37 meeting because, when we first started talking about our ministry team structure, and how it's working and how it's challenged, someone said, "It's like we've lost our skeleton." That comment got me thinking about Ezekiel's vision of the Valley of Dry Bones (Ezekiel 37:1-14). In that vision, Ezekiel saw a valley of dry and scattered bones and was asked the question, *"Mortal, can these bones live?"* Throughout the vision, Ezekiel learned that through the power of the spirit of God and because of the love of God, the dry bones *could* live, *could* be restored to life, to vitality, to activity. That vision has continued to inspire me and us, to believe that the Holy Spirit, moving in our congregation, can give us our skeleton back, can give us the tools that we need to do the work that God has called us to do together, in our time and place.

But, speaking of challenges, I'll be honest, those of who have been planning the Ezekiel 37 meeting are metaphorically kicking ourselves, because no one thought about checking the Patriot's game schedule until the Ezekiel 37 meeting was two weeks away and had already been publicized for weeks. Yes, we know that there's a Patriot's game during our Ezekiel 37 meeting. Yes, if we had thought to look at the schedule, we might have planned this meeting for a day when the Patriot's are not playing or are playing later in the day. But this is a perfect example of why we need more people involved in our ministry teams, more people at the table, more ideas and engagement. If we had had a die-hard, never miss a game, never DVR a game Patriot's fan helping us plan the Ezekiel 37 meeting, we might have looked at the schedule and planned for a different day. But, we didn't, so here we are, moving forward. We need people to come to the Ezekiel 37 meeting. We need <u>you</u> to come to the Ezekiel 37 meeting. So, let me tell you the advantage of DVR-ing a football game. You don't have to watch any of the commercials. If you start at the beginning an hour into a game, you can fast forward through the commercials and see the entire game! It's really fun!

You know what else will be fun and can't be DVR-ed? The Ezekiel 37 meeting! Come and learn about how we're moving forward at Emmanuel and how you can be a part of it!
