### The Whole and Holy Life Challenge - The Results!

As part of our Stewardship Campaign the Stewardship Team offered something called the Whole and Holy Life Challenge. The Challenge was an opportunity to develop and encourage some healthy habits in our lives while also helping participants to seek some balance in their lives. Participants tried to get points in six different categories: Nutrition, Physical Activity, Spirituality, Mind/Relationships, General

Health, and Stewardship. There were varieties of ways to get points in each category. In order for any points to count for the day, though, people had to get at least one point in every category.

To add a dimension of community and accountability to the challenge, participants were placed on teams. Every week the participants reported their scores to a team captain, who then reported the scores to Pastor Amanda. Because the teams were not even (some teams had just two participants, other teams had five) the final scores were determined by finding the average of the total points that the team earned (Weekly points added together and divided by the number of participants).

People have shared with me that the challenge was, well, challenging and even at times frustrating. (For example, realizing that you're still 1000 steps away from getting your physical activity point at 9:00 p.m. and spending an hour walking circles around your living room so that you don't let your team down can be pretty frustrating. I know because it happened to me.) But it was also eye opening about some aspects of their lives. The challenge helped people to be more mindful about how they live and how they tend their physical, emotional, relational, and spiritual health. The challenge inspired some to make healthy changes in their lives, that might turn into lasting habits.

And now, the moment that you've all been waiting for, the final results:

Team "O Holy Knights" finished the challenge with 349 points.

Team "Lassen 5" (which ended up being Lassen 2) finished the challenge with 407 points.

Team "Fab, Fit, & Faithful!" finished the challenge with 451 points.

Team "Shrek's Angels" finished the challenge with 644 points.

Team "Foxy Trotters" finished the challenge with 691 points.

And the winning team, was Team "Sunshine Challengers" with 773 points.

Congratulations to everyone who participated in the challenge!

For everyone who participated in the "Whole and Holy Life Challenge" the "Challenge" is over, but for all of us, the challenge continues, to live our whole lives as stewards of the gifts that God has given us. To care for ourselves, our bodies, minds, spirits, and relationships, to care for the communities that God has placed us in, and to care for the earth itself. In ways big and small we are called to be mindful of the ways that the things we do bring wholeness and healing to our own lives and to the world around us. We are called to treasure the gifts that God has blessed us with. We are called to live into and to celebrate and to share the abundance that God has given us. Let the joyful challenge continue!




#### Thank Yous...

#### **Advent Devotions**

This Advent, here at Emmanuel, we are going to create our own Advent Devotional, which will give us an opportunity to reflect on scripture and the Advent season, to see how it touches our hearts and then to write something that we can share with others at Emmanuel. The theme of our Advent Devotional will be "Waiting" since waiting is a pillar of the Advent season.



There will be a binder on the table next to Pastor Amanda's office (and in the office after the 11:15 service) that you can look through to choose a scripture passage that speaks to you. You take the form with the scripture passage that you have chosen and sign up on the sheet next to the binder for the day that you have chosen. You write your devotion and return it to the church office on or by **November 24**th. The devotions will be assembled into a booklet that will be distributed at Emmanuel on December 1st, the first Sunday in Advent. If you have any questions please see the FAQs or ask Pastor Amanda.

#### **FAQs about the Advent Devotional:**

#### How old to you have to be to participate?

Any age! Children are welcome to participate and we are also eager to hear the wisdom that the oldest among us can share. Families could also write a devotion together.

#### How long does my devotion have to be? (A related question...) How long can it be?

There is no assigned length for the devotions, but 200-500 words is a good target length. If you can say everything that you want to say in fewer words that's fine. If you need more words to say what you need to say, that's fine too! 200-500 is kind of a broad average.

#### I'm shy. What if I want to participate but I really don't want to sign what I wrote?

You can submit a devotion anonymously. (However, sharing your name is encouraged, as that helps us build community with one another.)

#### Are there any sample devotions I can look at?

You can take a look at the Christ in our Home booklets (in the Narthex and the Hallway) to get an idea. There are also some sample devotions in the Narthex and in the Hallway outside of Pastor's office, which were written by people at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church a few years ago. (Those devotions were for Lent, but even though it's a different season, the concept is the same.)

#### Exactly what do I have to do if I want to participate?

Chose a form for a day/scripture reading that speaks to you from the binder on the table outside of Pastor Amanda's office (it will be in the Narthex after the second service). Sign up for the day you have chosen. Spend some time thinking about/praying about the scripture reading you have chosen. Write a reflection on that scripture reading. Give it a title. Write a brief prayer that goes along with it. If there was a particular part of your scripture reading that inspired your devotion, list it on the form as well. Return your devotion to Pastor Amanda in person, by mail, or by email on or by November 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### How will these devotions be distributed?

A devotional booklet with our writings will be distributed at church on December 1<sup>st</sup>, the first Sunday of Advent. They will also be emailed out to anyone in our congregation who is interested in receiving them by email. There will also be a place on the form where you can indicate if you are okay with having your devotion included on our church's website/social media.

# **Friday Night Live**

#### **Ezekiel 37 Initiative**

The Ezekiel 37 Initiative got off to a good start with our initial introductory meeting on October 6<sup>th</sup>, the Leadership Training Event on October 27<sup>th</sup>, and our first Alpha Group meeting on November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

For those who might be wondering, "What is the Ezekiel 37 Initiative?" here is a brief description. Ten of our Ministry Teams have been divided into two groups, the Alpha Group and the Beta group. The Alpha Group, which is also called the Worship/Outreach Group includes the Worship Ministry Team, the Learning Ministry Team, the Mission Fund Team, the Welcome Witness Ministry Team, and the Service Ministry Team. The Beta Group is also called the Administration/Fellowship Group and includes the Finance Ministry Team, the Property Ministry Team, the Youth Ministry Team, the Fellowship Ministry Team, and the Stewardship Ministry Team.

For the Ezekiel 37 Initiative these teams will meet four times a year on assigned dates. The teams will gather together for prayer and devotion at 12:30 p.m. Then the teams will go to their separate meetings to work on their separate agendas and Pastor Amanda will meet with each of them for about 15 minutes. A little before 2:00 p.m. each team will gather again in Kask Hall to close the meetings with the Lord's Prayer.

The purpose of the Ezekiel 37 meetings is to:

- · Reduce the difficulty of trying to find meeting times for the ministry teams
- · Encourage ministry teams to meet regularly
- Encourage more people to get involved in leadership at Emmanuel, by making meetings well publicized well in advance and turning our ministry team meetings into community building events
- Get our skeleton back (Hence the Ezekiel 37 name—see: Ezekiel 37:1-14), which means to restore and strengthen our organizational structure so that we do the work that God has called us together to do effectively.

We had our first "Group Meeting" the "Alpha Group" on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. There are still some logistics to work out to make these meetings run smoothly and meet our goals, but we are learning from every experiment and look forward to seeing this initiative grow and improve throughout the year.

The best way to find out what the Ezekiel 37 Initiative is all about is to come to one of the meetings. Pick a ministry team that interests you and come to an Alpha Group Meeting or a Beta Group Meeting. (Or both!) All of us are needed and invited!
